“Native Turf Alternatives” by Brendan “Skip” Healy



Join us as we learn about reducing turf by using native plants. We will also hear of the importance of using certain mulch blends and permeable aggregates.

Our speaker is Brendan “Skip” Healy. A Brevard native who grew up in West Melbourne. He graduated from MCC and earned a Bachelors in Agribusiness with a Horticulture minor from Mississippi State University.

After college, He interned at The Land Pavilion in Walt Disney World’s EPCOT, and has since managed greenhouse and nursery operations in Sarasota, Indian River and Brevard Counties.

Skip established Change of Greenery in 2018 to implement Florida native & edible landscapes that provide habitat to native pollinators and wildlife. He takes pride in using sustainable approaches, without the use of harmful chemicals, and in order to preserve Brevard’s natural beauty.

South Lake Conservation Area

Saturday, March 21st, 2020 0900—1200

Join Dr. Paul Schmalzer as we explore the South Lake Conservation Area. This beautiful area was a mitigation donation to the Brevard County Environmentally Endangered Lands Program.

There has been extensive restoration by cutting and burning, timber thinning, and exotic plant treatment.

Vegetation is primarily oak scrub, scrubby flatwoods, and mesic flatwoods. An experimental translocation of Florida Scrub-Jays to the property began in 2009,

Directions:



1) I-95 to exit 220 Garden Street (ST. Rt. 406). West 0.6 miles on Garden Street to North Carpenter Road. North 1.5 miles on N. Carpenter to Dairy Road. West 1.1 miles on Dairy Road. Turn North (right) on Lancaster Lane (not paved) and park by the gate.

OR

2) US1 to Dairy Road. West on Dairy Road. Cross North Carpenter Road. West 1.1 mile on Dairy Road. Turn North (right) on Lancaster Lane (not Paved) and park by gate.

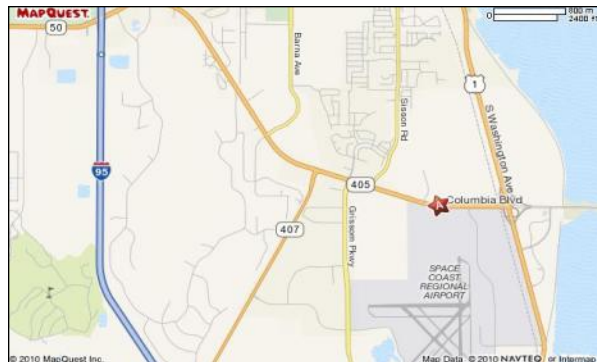

Driving Directions to the Sanctuary:

From I-95 Northbound: take SR-407 Exit 212 east 2.7 miles to SR-405 intersection. Turn right onto SR-405 and go east 1.9 miles (the Sanctuary entrance is on the left 0.4 miles past Sisson Road)
From I-95 Southbound: take SR-50 Exit 215 east. Turn left onto SR 50 and turn right onto SR-405 (2nd light) Travel 3.6 miles (the Sanctuary entrance is on the left 0.4 miles past Sisson Road)

From U.S. HWY 1: go west 0.5 miles on SR-405 in south Titusville. Sanctuary entrance is on the right.
